




Alexandre Luu

Born in 1987, Alexandre Luu studied drawing and art printing at EnsAD in Paris. He lives and works in Paris.

His most recent works are inspired by travel and holiday pictures found on social networks such as Instagram and Tinder. Some details and characters of the pictures are isolated and reproduced as such or associated with other pictures to create a dialogue between pictures. Sometimes, Alexandre Luu adds his own elements to those new images adding absurdity, poetry or melancholy to give an always surprising result.

Alexandre Luu is inspired by many artists although Caspar David Friedrich and the swimming pools of David Hockney are the most obvious ones.



Priscille Depinay

Priscille Depinay grew up in Normandy (France). She graduated from Ecole des Beaux-Arts de Rouen and now lives in Paris where she works for a number of magazines and newspapers, publishers and the fashion industry.

Marked by poetry and sensibility, her work questions the polymorphic nature of mankind and the position of individuals within social entities and communities.



Ana Popescu

Ana Popescu is a visual artist and illustrator working mainly with drawing and colours on paper.

Born in Romania, she grew up in France and moved to Vienna, Austria, in 2008 where she studied printmaking and drawing at the University of Applied Arts. She graduated in 2013 and received a Master of fine Arts with distinction.

Since 2009, Ana took part in various group exhibitions including « The Essence », the yearly exhibition of the University of applied Arts, group exhibitions in Tokyo, Shanghai and New York, at the Griffin Gallery in London (2015) or at the Wittgentstein Haus in Vienna (2017). She also showed her work in solo exhibitions at the 21er Haus in Vienna (2016), at Ravnikar Gallery Space in Ljubljana, in Bergen, Norway (2018). Her work has also been published in Architectural Digest, Selected Europe 2017 and Printed Pages amongst others.



Marie Baudet

Marie Baudet was born in la Rochelle and now lives in the Paris area. She holds a diploma from a film school and also studied graphic design at the Gobelins school.

Inspired by stories and the characters in them, painting has allowed her to explore the theme of memories with her series « Family Album » but also the theme of intimacy with her series « Love Stories ». The realism she projects takes us down a joyous nostalgic road and confronts us with our own emotions.

The flourishing and precise details take us on a voyage through her colorful and naive yet elegant paintings.



Isabel Albertos

Isabel Albertos is an illustrator and graphic designer. She has a BFA (Complutense University - Madrid) and a Diploma in Production Design (ECAM - Madrid). She is based in Madrid where she works in a studio with other graphic artists and teaches Graphic Design and Illustration at Saint Louis University - Madrid.

Besides teaching, Isabel works on different types of projects like editorial illustration, brand identity and she has been the art director for Brief Festival for the past five years.


Along the years, she has taken part in several solo and collective shows and she has won several prizes. In 2018 she received the Communication Arts Award of Excellence.



Hugo Ruyant

Hugo Ruyant, born in 1992, works between Paris and Brussels. After completing his studies at The Cambre, he participates in the Aftershave expo at the Moonens Foundation and To Play at Sagacity in Brussels then Out of Sight in Geneva and Cshiii in Paris in 2018.

Through prints and installations, Hugo Ruyant converts abstract story-telling into visual arts. The stories he tells use people and landscapes as poetic tools.



Florent Groc

Visual artist Florent Groc works on the thin line that separates or rather unites abstraction and depiction.

Originally from Marseille and a resident of the Levat Convent (an artist's residence) he finds his inspiration as much in his immediate surroundings as he does in his imagination. He sees the world not as a sum of varying images but as a joyous, vibrant whole in constant mutation. His work is not only a composition of different shapes and colors that communicate amongst themselves, but it is also a vast experiment as he is constantly looking for new ways and techniques of artistic expression.



Klima Intérieurs

Klima Intérieurs is a brand that positions itself somewhere between Art, Design and craftmanship.

Much like an artist's collective, Klima is comprised of Sarah Espeute and Léa Bigot, two illustrators/artists/designers who express themselves through a wide array of mediums ranging anywhere from an image to an object.

This is a new way of conceptualising interior decorating which starts with an illustration which can then lead to actual decorative and unique or limited edition objects that are hand designed by the two friends in collaboration with different artisans.

Johanna Noack



Léopoldine Siaud



Thomas Symonds, born in 1987, is a half French half English photographer, filmmaker and painter. He co-founded and still directs Papier Magazine, a quarterly review dedicated to contemporary drawing and illustration.

He strives to explore beauty in the everyday things, be it through street photography, pen and pencil sketches or short writings. Thomas is the director of the French documentary "Immergées", following the French synchronised swimming team during the 2016 olympics, and teaches photography at Penninghen school in Paris.

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
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PAPIER MAGAZINE

A bi-annual high-end magazine dedicated to illustration

Papier Magazine was consulted on this project, to help curate the exhibition of artworks, hand in hand with PAI Community.

12 artists were finally chosen, out of the 300 illustrators from all over the world, who had previously worked with the magazine on one of their past issues.

Papier Magazine was born from the love of its founders for illustration. The format (28cm x 38cm closed) and the quality of the printing, make it a unique object on the market.

Papier Magazine invites 20 illustrators, who have an influence and originality in contemporary illustration, from 5 different countries, to create an original artwork for the magazine.

With each issue is a new theme, and have already been published issues on Sport, Luxury, Provocation, Color... and have colaborated with establishments such as Colette, Carlin and Relais & Chateaux.

Papier Magazine provides illustration fans a quality object they can keep and collect, whilst promoting emerging and established artists from all over the world.
